

James Robinson Cravens lived on the family farm that was established when his maternal great-grandparents immigrated from Yorkshire, England to Buffalo Hart, Illinois. After attending the University of Illinois, he returned to the farm to help his semi-retired father, run the 2,000 acres. This is where James raided his family and became active in the community. He participated om the Tri-City School Board for 17 years, sat on the Board of Farmers State Bank of Buffalo for 44 years, was on the Board of Directors Farm Supply, member of the Sangamon County Farm Bureau, Cooperative Extension Council, 50 year member of the Masonic Lodge, Springfield Consistory and an Ansar Shine. He also served on the Board of the Buffalo Hart Presbyterian Church. In 1968 he had the honor of entertaining Hubert Humphrey, our Vice President of the United States, and in 1969 Hosted the Farm Progress Show. James received the Master Farmer Award in 1971 and in 1972 the family farm was names a Centennial Farm.
