His first tractor was a Case steel wheeled tractor. He began harvesting corn by hand later began using a New Idea ear picker to fill the corn crib. His first combine was a Massey Ferguson 410.

Livestock has always been a big part of Sid's farming operation. He and his father went to Texas to buy cattle to raise and feed. Hogs have been on the farm from the beginning with sows and litters, 4-H pigs and market pigs.
