Hi service to the community included sitting on the Auburn School Board, Sangamon County Soil and Water District Board, Sangamon County Farm Bureau Board, Auburn Cemetery Board, and still actively supports local projects he feels are valuable to the community.

His latest environmental project is the SAFE program. This program plants areas north of Thayer into grasses, flowers (and unwelcomed weeds) that are conducive to raising Quail. It is called Quail Hill and many have seen the result of that effort with frequent siting's of Quail in the area.
